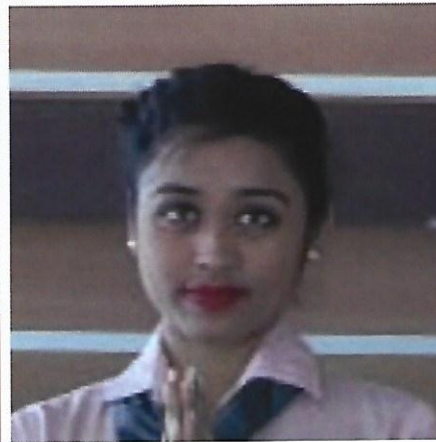
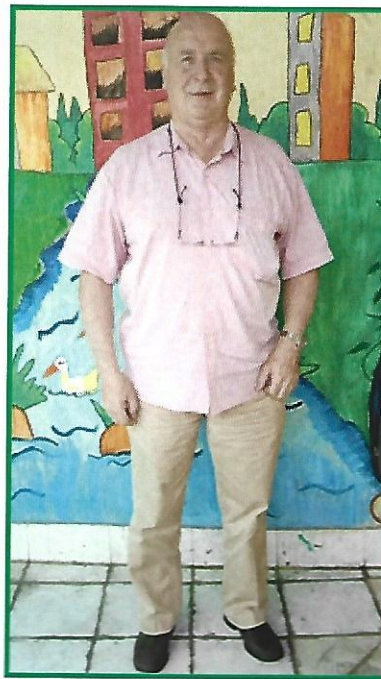

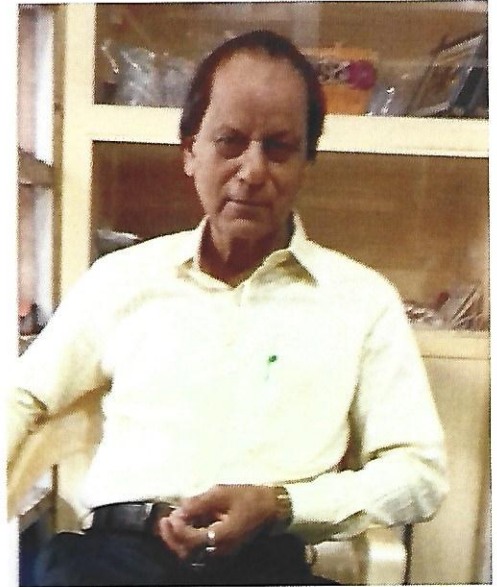

PASCHIM BANGA KRIRA- O- JANAKALYAN PARISHAD (PBKOJP) started its activities in the urban areas in the year 1999 with special emphasis on street & working children, sex workers & their children, platform children and the children of other marginalised sections of the society. These endeavors are continuously being supported by - HOPE FOUNDATION, IRELAND, EMBASSY OF IRELAND, FUCAP- SPAIN, LES GALOPINS DE CALCUTTA- FRANCE, RAILWAYS CHILDREN- UK, ARTVENTURE- SINGAPORE, ADMINISTRACIONES APODAKA S.L.- SPAIN, GALENS BARCELONA and by US AID through REACH INDIA. Over the preion, this social development organisation has initiated programs in health, income oriented vocational training, counseling, medical support, cricket coaching, relief and rehabilitation. Through a number of coaching and multi-school schematic interventions, the organisation is directly benefitting thousand of children belonging to the vulnerable section of the society. The operational areas are- Kalighat redlight area, Majerhat withen the harijan community and kidderpore withen the slum and 14 Anna withen the pavement dwellers and the remotest part of south 24 parganas in the area of Sunderban.

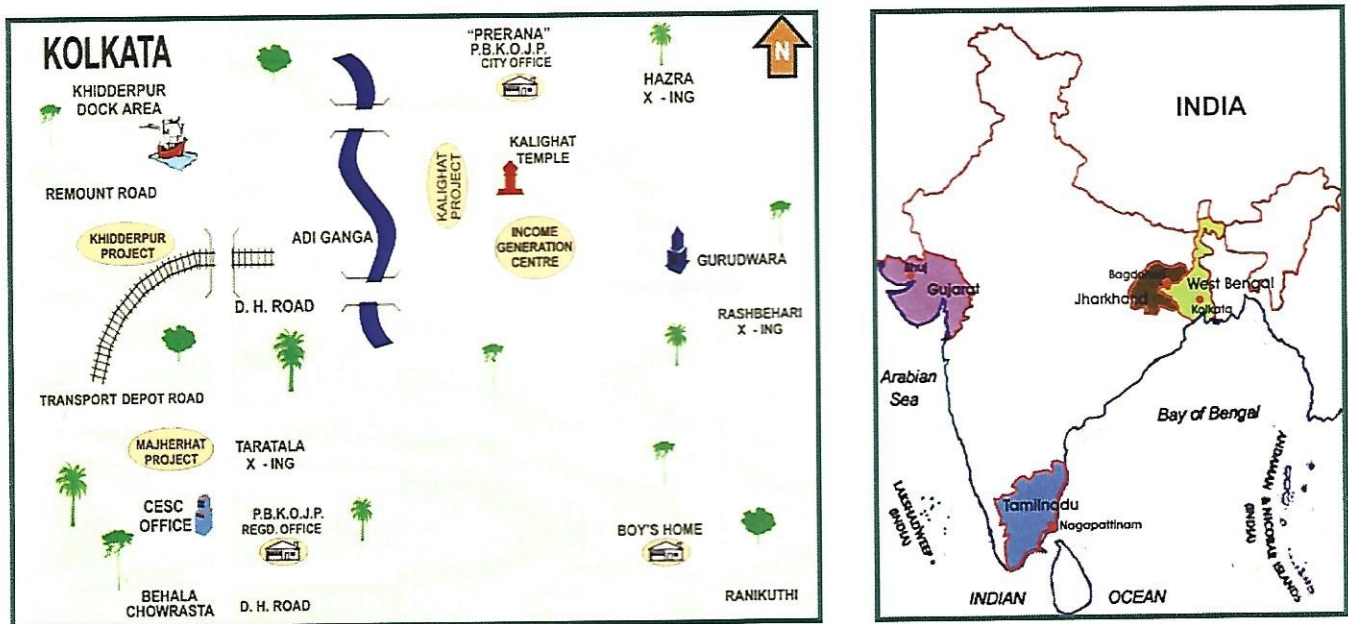
MISSION

Amaar Basha Home for Girls'

ABOUT US:

Paschim Banga Krira-O- Janakalyan Parishad (PBKOJP), had founded its first protection home in the year 2003, at the premises of 146D Harish Mukherjee Road, in order to empower the girl child of Kalighat Red Light area. The quality of service satisfied the targeted population of Kalighat and very soon there was a demand for more and more accommodation for these girls. So, the need arose to start more number of protection home. To increase the number of 16 girls to more number of Girls.

PBKOJP was trying to reach more number of Girls. C'est Mon Reve was approached by PBKOJP in the year 2017 in order to start a new home for more of these girls. So that PBKOJP could cater to more girls in need of their service. A new home was started in January 2018 with accommodation along with other facilities for 18 girls of the Red Light Area mostly from Kalighat.

The main objective of PBKOJP is to take these girls to mainstream by strengthening them with proper care and formal education, so that they can be placed successfully in various jobs in the society according to the talent of the girls.

The Protection Home Aamar Basha started in Behala on 3rd January 2018 with the kind help of C'est Mon Reve. All 18 girls have been admitted to a reputed government school for formal education. Apart from this they are getting educational support from the home tutor and the 3 house mothers. Simultaneously, House mothers are getting training by resource person and the Girls are also getting training in dance and drawing according to their talents, Private tutor for general subjects and science teacher for Mathematics and other science subject for higher class girls engaged on regular basis for their future progress. Art teacher helping the girls for painting classes. Choreographer teacher for dance training. Music teacher for singing classes.

Facilities : Girls are getting quality education, good Nutritious food, Counseling support, Medical support with Cashless medical insurance support, Festival dress, Casual dress, Exposure trip, Local outing. Etc.

Achivement:

Brishti Pramanik a girl always with her smiling face. Brishti along with her family, taking their meal only one time a day. Her family running with severe poverty. Most of the day, she had taken her meal with puffed rice. Getting admission at Aamar Basha home presently, she is enjoying her life getting experienced her life by leaving with poverty. At present she is the student of class VIII. She selected as monitor of her class due to her sincerity and leadership quality. She is getting favored from the class teachers always due to her soft attitude and paying attention on home work and always an innocent smiling face. It's an example before us that how facilities and environment may help to change the life of a child.



After Care Project For Boys'

The above 18 Boys

Normally as per Govt. rules the inmates of our Boys Home restored and we keep them as paying guest to a different rented Flat. Aftercare is a measure for rehabilitation and social reintegration of young adults who leave institutional childcare system on attaining certain age as specified law. The children going out from child care institute are vulnerable to unemployment, psychological stress, physical and mental insecurity, homelessness. Thus, these boys are provided financial support for shelter, house rent, training, higher studies, medical allowances etc. Even our organisation supports psychological counselling to those who are facing emotional trauma. So, during this 2019-2020 period we are mainstreaming 11 boys. We admitted these boys with different subjects like Hotel Management, English, Geography, Multimedia, French, and Physical Education Honours in different reputed Colleges like Amity Kolkata, Amity Noida, Kolkata St Xaviers and Ashutosh College. One is admitted in IIHM Kolkata. Hope as a Charitable Organisation finally we will be fulfilled our dreams to make the boys economically independent and self-reliant.



After care project for Elder Girls' (TEMP)

PBKOJP running Boys home since from the year 2001 and Girls home since from the year 2003 October. The age of all these children that period were around 8 to 10 years. Running the home few years, the members of **PBKOJP** realized that when the children will cross the age of 18 years what will be our next step and specially the Boys and Girls those who are willing to continue their higher studies. Because under the Government protection home license rules the Boys and Girls after crossing the age of 18 years they are not permissible to stay in the protection home. All these issues motivated **PBKOJP** members to organize focus group discussion involving the children to make our future strategy. The result of the discussion emerged to start the After Care project for the Girls and Boys who have crossed the age of 18 years.

Presently **PBKOJP** started few years back After Care Project for the Girls and had taken a rented building primarily and also started after care project for the Boys in a small form. The Girls who are staying at our protection Home and crossed their age of 18 years and willing to continue their studies they are permissible to stay at our protection home for Girls. At present 6 Girls are staying at our After Care Project. The status of the Girls at present it may considered as achievement also;

1. **Baby Roy** completed Graphic Design and working as volunteer with a corporate sector. Most probably in January she will get a job in the same institution.

2. **Sonia Sardar** completing her graduation with honors in Political Science. Presently admitted in Kolkata University for Master degree in political science and completed her first semester online examination securing with 80% marks and preparing herself for west Bengal Government Civil Service examination (WBCS)



3. **Nandini Mondal** studying South Kolkata College honors in History. At present she is the student of 3rd year

4. **Nandini Das** completed her 2nd year training on Primary Health Care. Presently she is working as intern attached with AMRI Hospital.

5. **Tuktuki Mondal** got married recently due to her family problem but her husband assured us that his support will be always with Tuktuki so that she can complete her Food and Beverage course.

6. **Reba Sarkar** completed Hotel Management course with securing 80% marks and joined Taj Hotel in Bangalore.



Thanks to all our supporting partners for their contribution to fulfill the dream of all these hapless girls so that they can get an opportunity to mainstream themselves in the society by exploring their talent.

Enhance Skill Development (Supported by Maria Gabriela Rezola Sansinenea)

PBKOJP implementing the vocational Training Programme for years together. The knowledge and experience gathered helped us to visualize the need of a skill development center that would help the beneficiaries to enhance their skill. The skill will help the beneficiaries to perfectly make marketable product in various shapes and sizes, and this will help them to earn their living. Hence we have setup a skill development center where the beneficiaries would get an opportunity to start their earning.

Objective:

To strengthen and empower the women folk of the community economically, so that they can take care of themselves and their children. Women folk who discontinue their studies due to financial insolvency may be interested to enroll their names in the skill development centre and their monthly income will help them to continue their studies. The Enhance Skill Development Center only entertain the women folk who completed their certificate course successfully from the vocational training center of PBKOJP.

Achievement:

The beneficiaries of our Enhance Skill Development Center gradually upgrading their skill and presently few of them are capable of making any design which may sports garments, Track suit, T-shirt and so many designs according to the need of the clients.

Gabriela is supporting the project including the Honorarium of Trainer. Trainees are getting all facilities at free of cost getting an opportunity to use five thread, after lock and general machine. Selling their making materials by the trainees the profit amount under the PBKOJP guidance they are distributing within themselves. This may help the women folk to continue their studies and may help to support their family. The amount may be small but it is the beginning to start their income at their own. Thanks Gabriela for supporting the project and pray before her so that she might extend her support for a longer period. Gabriela is also supporting Doctor's Salary, Choreographer Salary and Education sponsorship programme.



Green Field Project (Implemented by PBKOJP & Supported by Girl 2B Foundation)

Majerhat is an ancient important locality in the southern outskirts of the city of Kolkata by the local railway system of the eastern Railway. Majerhat is on the Sealdah – Budge Budge section of the Indian Railways. From time immemorial, this place is known for its business potential for being strategically located on the Eastern side of the river Ganges, connected by both surface and river transport. No doubt the Britishers found it a gateway to Kolkata harbour. It is needless to mention that the Majerhat did play a vital role in the development of the entire southern Bengal.

Thus it is obvious that Majerhat should draw the attention of all rich and poor, producer and consumer, transporters and commuters, all for the purpose to make a quick buck. On one hand localities like Alipore & New Alipore sprang up and on the other hand poor man's hut also came up around this place. These poor people have been occupying Government and Railway Lands with a humble plastic roof cover up that poses as an apology for the dwellings.

These hapless Harijan community people have their children, who without any opportunity for coming up in life, often turn into hard core criminals and anti-social. PBKOJP had a long cherished dream to work in this area with some development Activities, mainly with the children whose infancy is spent in utter negligence, adolescence has been shattered and their dreams and hopes dumped under enormous pressure which ultimately forces them to work in different vocations and earn. This earning of money at such an early age gives them an easy access to Alcohol, Drugs and unsafe sexual practices. In their world education is almost Nil. For persisting their existence, they quite often find themselves in criminal dens and eventually in police custody where they succumb to either incurable diseases or to police action. Their life ends long before their old age comes to fetch their life away.

The beneficiaries are being the Horizon community, which is still considered as an un-touchable community. This migrated community mostly from Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. They migrated in search for better job and for better living conditions, but since they are illiterate and unskilled they failed to get better jobs rather than working as daily laborers or sweepers.

PBKOJP started an education center at Majerhat with the support of **GIRL-2B Foundation**. Objective of the programme : Improved the education status of the targeted children so that they can complete a minimum level of education and this will help them to make a plan for their future whether they will continue their education or will enroll their name in any life skill training programme.

The entire education system of the center is divided into two session: Afternoon session for the children who are studying in class I to class IV and Evening session for the children studying



class V to class X. Improved discipline, physique and behavioural status of the targeted children of Majerhat.

Physical and mental well-being be the main target, inflicting the competitive attitude and overcoming the trauma of being beaten in life is also the aim of the component.

Facilities available: Beneficiaries are getting free education, Nutrition, Exercise Books at free of cost, School admission fees, School Bag, Recreational activities.

No of beneficiaries: 30 children in the Afternoon session and 25 children in the Evening session.

Health programme: To protect the local environment free from pollution we planted 20 pieces Debdaru plant. Each plant protected by guard wall made by Bamboo stick. Each tree named in the name of one afternoon children and the same children family will look after the growth of the trees. The name of the children painted on a tin plate and fixed on the guard wall. We distributed 200 Mosquito net towards the community people of Majerhat to save guard the children and their family from Malaria, Dengue and other mosquito bite diseases. We conducted a survey how many community people using net.

Achievement: 80% community people are using mosquito net, rest are not familiar using mosquito net during night time. Our volunteers are helping them to understand the necessity for using of mosquito net during night time.



'Prerona' Protection Home for High Risk Girls

Prerona Home for to 6 to 18 years old girls, run by Paschim Banga Krira O Janakalyan Parishad is situated at 146D, Harish Mukherjee Road, Kolkata 700025, Ward No. 73, under Kolkata Municipal Corporation of India, Kalighat Road, Kolkata-25. COVID pandemic situation in 2020 aggravated the problems of the commercial sex workers who are residing at Kalighat red light area. Due to COVID 19 fear the clients of the sex workers totally stopped visiting the sex workers of the red light area. Moreover who were engaged as domestic helper, daily labourer, community leader, in that area also lost their job. The situation was so



pathetic that the parents of the children were unable to manage two square meals every day. If their children would stay with them then the children would face to fulfil their basic needs, due to financial crisis of their family. Post pandemic there was a possibility of the child trafficking from this area. The children who used to go to their school could not attend the school due to lockdown and pandemic. So the children were unable to meet their school mates which might lead the mental stress of the children.

However in this lockdown situation Prerona Protection home for Girls provided care and Protection to the children of Commercial sex workers of Kalighat area which includes- Nutrition, online education, telephonic counselling session, video call, online computer class and spoken English class, craft and dance class for recreational activities,

many national and international voluntaries have been taken online group activities for the children recreation. Therefore Protection Home played a significant role in the life of the children of commercial sex workers by ensuring four basic rights; Rights to Survival, Rights to Protection, Rights to Development and Rights to Participation of the children. Superintendent, case worker of the protection home regular basis contacted with the family of the children and gave suggestion on free ration system of the Govt. and how they handle the crisis situation. Counsellor gave telephonic family counselling to all family members and gave precautionary measures which have been taken.

Significant Achievements in the Pandemic Situation:

- PBKOJP also extended its support to their family members of the children by providing some-free ration (Rice, dal, Potato, oil, onion, Soya bin, chickpea etc), nutritious food and grocery item;
- 11 Elder children of Prerona Protection Home who are 14years or above age have started 1-year training in Tailoring at the Vocational training unit of PBKOJP under the guidance of Craft Teacher since August'20. Since January'2021 4 children are doing soft skill training in stitching. This will help them in their future endeavours. They have already learned to make masks and pillow/ cushion covers. In soft skill training children are learning using different types of stitches, fabric colour making handkerchief.
- Apart from these children are doing their regular dance and drawing classes. They have made beautiful portraits, home decorating materials, beautiful dances etc.

- In this time period children get interested about cooking and some of the elder children making delicious dishes such as egg roll, preparations of chicken, baked cake, Kachuri, soyabean curry etc. learning it from YouTube with the help of housemothers.
- In this time period children have participated in Child Rights week celebration organised by DCPU. They have competed in tongue twister competition and role play competition.
- Children of Prerona Protection Home have participated in online 'BINGO' game organized by HOPE volunteers.
- 13 families have enlisted their name in Swastha Sathi Scheme. The scheme was officially launched by Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal on 30th December 2016. It gives Basic health cover for secondary and tertiary care up to Rs. 5 lakh per annum per family, Paperless, Cashless, Smart Card based, All pre existing diseases are covered.
- All the families are getting free ration services.



VIVEK Boys' Home

Introduction & Objectives:

The "Vivek Boys Home" is situated at 58/7A, Kolkata-700092, and Ward No. 98 under Kolkata Municipal Corporation of West Bengal, India. At present we have 10 boys between 6 to 11 years at our residential Project. The Project's mission is to mainstreaming the boys in the Society. Most of these children are coming from the Kalighat Red Light Area of the deprived and unfortunate families who are under below Poverty Line (BPL). Our vision is to see the holistic development and growth of each child.

Activities:

We immediately admitted these boys in local Govt. Schools. But unfortunately from 15th March 2020 we experienced an unknown situation and add a new word in our dictionary "Lockdown" without attending School or any outdoor activities. There have been many areas of growth and development throughout the year. PBKOJP staffs are working directly to this new group which helped the boys to relieve their stress find space for self-reflection and get guidance in handling difficult situation, and make them happy with the new environment. They were receiving tuitions of all subjects from our Home tutor through video calls; they attend the School online classes. Also they are engaged to do paintings with the help of an Art teacher and one of our



ex boy takes dance class which is very interesting and entertaining for the children. During strict lockdown period all the teachers, coordinator and counselor did their jobs through zoom only. The Coordinator, counselor, Tutor, School Head mistress kept contacts with the Children over phone calls and video calls and often visited Home maintaining the safety measurements. We try to keep all the original proper documents of the Boys with us so that in case of any Govt. visit we can produce the certificates to the Authority and proof as genuine case. We maintained many registers to run the Boys Home in methodological way, for example

Admission register Staff meeting register, Children Committee meeting register, and of course Individual Care Plan of each Children etc. We used to have group meetings among staffs and Boys. The issues discussed in the meetings are prepared by the children themselves, few are raised by the Coordinator and staffs also to resolve our internal problems and accordingly prepare the Action Plans to achieve our Goals.

Achievements:

The commitment of Boys Home team and management committee have steadily helped us progress towards our Goals. Our Home is a breathing space where boys can simply enjoy being children. Our staffs effortlessly made a magical bonding with this new group so that at present the group is well settled. We noticed that during this Pandemic situation they were comfortable to be with us staying at our Home. When these little kids joined, few were extremely weak in studies, but during this Corona situation they got

much time to have individual attention so they did a speedy development. We visualize a great bonding and happiness among the children and also with the staffs. "Love" is the key word of our success for over all achievements. We also noticed that our boys have precise talents and skills in different areas like Dance, Paintings and Music which they need to nurture through proper trainings.



CELEBRATIONS AND RECREATIONS:

As our "Home" is a residential project this year also we celebrated Bengali New Year, Independence Day, Durga Puja, Dewali, Holi, Birthdays of inmates, Saraswati Puja, Raksha Bandhan and other occasions with safety measures .On our Annual day children performed cultural programmes within a small group and had delicious special lunch and tiffin as usual. We did a zoo trip and an outstation Shantiniketan Programme as a part of our educational trip. We also organized Sports and prize distribution ceremony. We also organized a Football match with the interest of our aftercare boys last year during unlock period which treated as medicine to our boys in pandemic situation.

Vocational Training Unit

Supported by - Apodaka S L (Spain)

The project is meant for the hapless women folk of the society who are talented and looking after any opportunity to explore their talent and utilizing there talent to get any alternative way of their livelihood.

Objective of the project :

Capacitated the women folk and engaged them who are in difficult situation. Trained them under women entrepreneurship training programme, so that they can make a plan for their future.

Activities:

Trainees are coming from the different areas of our surrounding operational areas. Due to Covid-19 we are conducting training tailoring class for 3 days in a week. We are following a syllabus for 18 months. After completion of the training we are providing certificate before the trainees. The trainees who are willing to start any Boutique or any small tailoring shop or willing to work at her home by installing a small machine for further to familiarize with finished marketing product she may join our enhance skill development production unit and get training under advance training machine.

Facilities available

Apodaka S L is bearing the cost of every items including the Trainer salary, Machine repairing, electricity and training materials. Apodaka S L also supporting PBKOJP administrative expenses and salary of one domestic helper.



Future plan of paschim Banga Krira -O- Janakalyan Parishad

Envision a future full of possibilities of those taking forward of our ideas and thoughts of social change and also the implementation of those ideas as well. The tireless attempt towards perfections is what we seek to achieve. The future plan of PBKOJP are thus not mere plans but are the dreams of all the employees and beneficiaries. The future plan comprises of some severe issues which needs immediate planning and future action for the whole some development of the marginalized section of the society.

After care project for for the Boys and Girls

The boys and girls who have crossed the age of 18 years and continuing studies they are staying two different rented building and different area also. But most of the boys and Girls have started their life by doing their job according to their qualification and some of them got married and maintaining family. Next Batch of PBKOJP boys and girls will cross the age of 18 years after a gap of 4 years calculating from now. We may approach our previous supporting organization for future support. We have to make our strategy what will be our next approach so that the Boys and Girls can continue their studies getting crossed their age of 18 years.

Free health clinic

PBKOJP is running an education center few years back in Majerhat. The children studying in the center are enjoying all facilities. The beneficiaries are very poor and belongs to Horizon community, the most backward community in India. The community people due to financial constraint avoiding to visit any doctor and not willing to visit government hospital because have to spent more time and travel cost is high. Secondly most of the Medicine is not available in hospital store. At any serious condition most of the time they are taking loan by paying a good interest from outside people. To safe guard the community people from all these inhuman situation we would like to start a free health clinic in Majerhat.

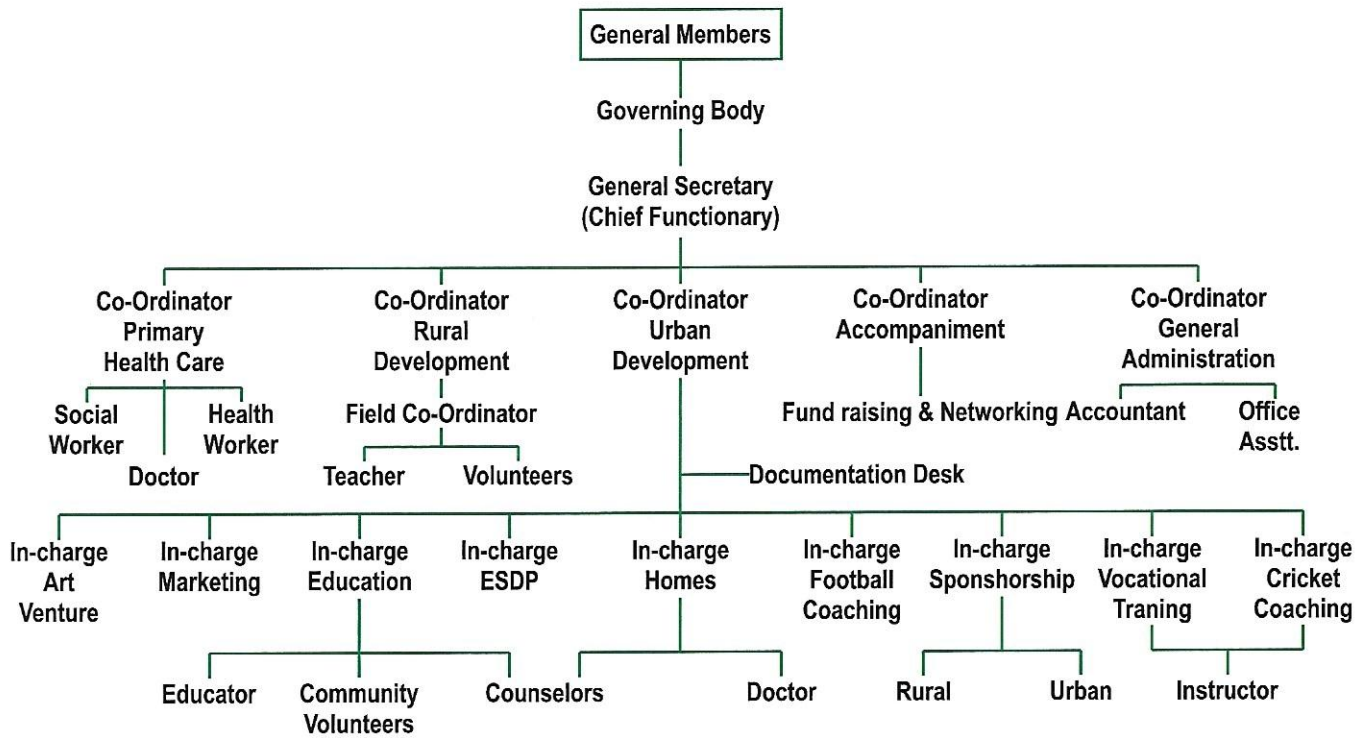

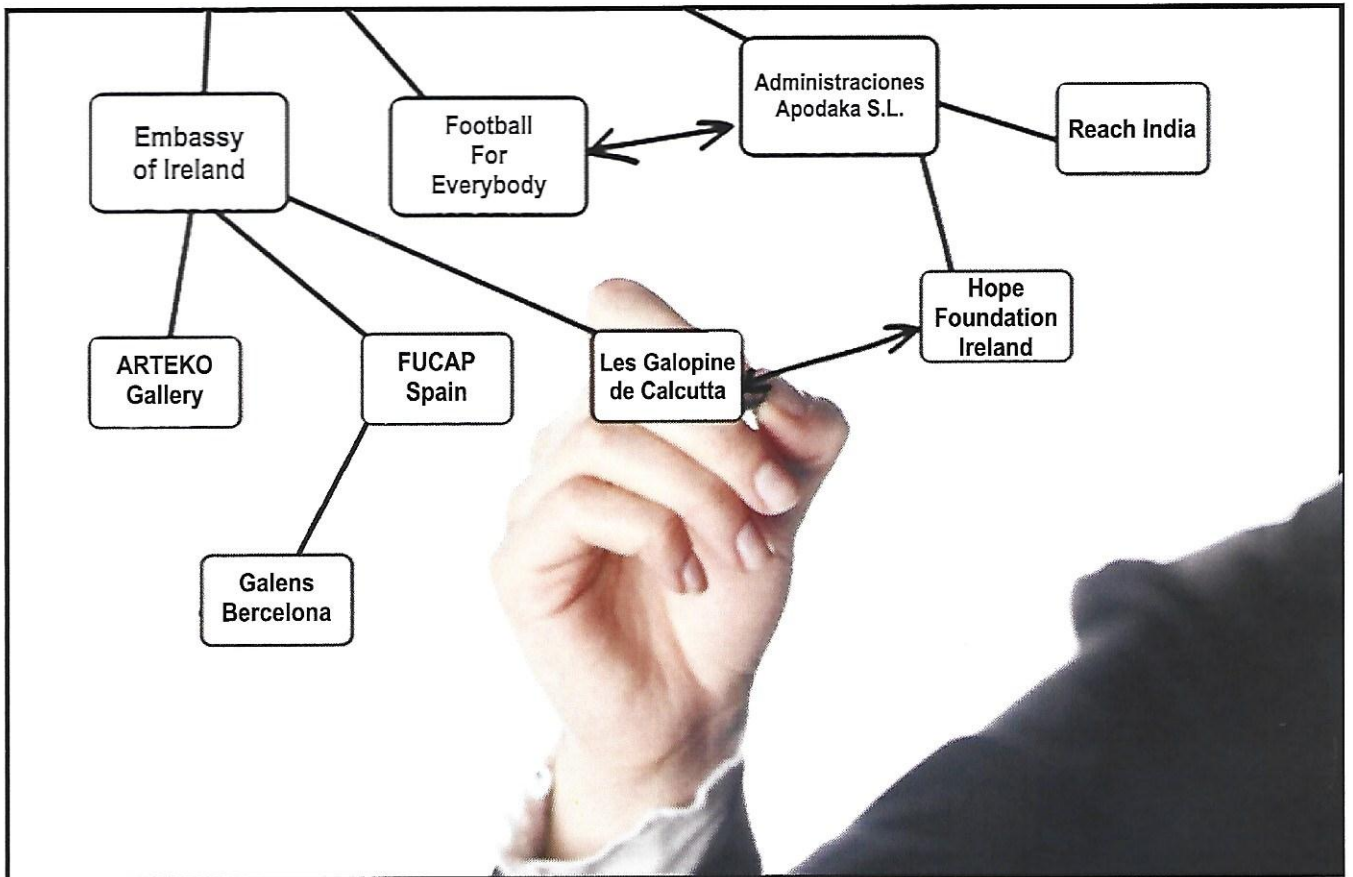

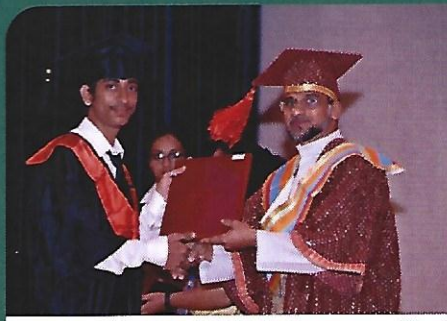
Structure, Organogram and Networking
